



## New changes to garbage collection and recycling

#### Standardization of containers (effective January 1st, 2018)

Since July 2016, the Municipality of **Mille-Isles** is applying it's new by-law on the removal and disposal of waste. To do this, various actions have to be undertaken by each citizen in order to improve the environmental performance of the Municipality.

The trash and recycling bins will be standardized throughout the territory of the municipality of Mille-Isles before January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018.

**By January 1st, 2018,** any other color of bin will not be accepted and will not be picked up.

Trash bin
Description: With wheels and handles
Volume: 240 litres ou 360 litres
Colors: green, black or charcoal grey





Trash bin: You can buy one at a retail store or, you can order at the Municipality. Contact Ms. Chrystine Slight at (450) 438-2958 ext 2600 or by email: cslight@mille-isles.ca

**Recycling bin:** You can get it at a retailer or municipality. The cost is \$ 105 taxes included for a 360 liter bin.

**Garbage collection calendar (effective January 1st, 2017):** For all collections, bins can be placed on the side of the street no earlier than 5 p.m. the day before the scheduled collection and they must be removed before midnight the day of the collection.

Also, the bins must be placed at the curb with the handles and wheels facing the house.



\* Note: objects should not exceed 4 x 4 feet. compressor must be removed from freezers and fridges.

#### Bulky items (effective January 1st, 2017)

The collection of bulky items will be done **once a month**, along with the first garbage collection of the month. The bulky items are items that are too large to enter the trash bin and that are not recyclable.

#### **Prohibitions:**

To reduce the amount of unnecessary waste, here is a list of newly banned materials you cannot discard in the waste bin:


- All recyclable materials permitted by the sorting center (glass, plastic (1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 7), cardboard and metal), these materials must be placed in the recycling bin;
- **Construction, renovation and demolition waste**. These must be taken to the Ecocentre "Les bons amis" or an authorized recycling center;
- **Hazardous household waste**. Most are accepted but you can make sure by consulting the calendar of collection we mail you each year or visit our website to know what items must be taken to your Ecocentre "Les bons amis";
- Technology and communications items. These must be taken to your Ecocentre "Les bons amis";
- Green waste. Make grasscycling! It is the action to let the lawn clippings or dead leaves on the ground.
- **Other materials** (biomedical waste, for example). Bring them to your pharmacy who will know how to dispose of them safely.



## Why the changes?

It is shown that the standardization of waste and recycling bins ensures better cleanliness before and after collection. Also, it limits the amount of waste and promotes recycling and composting.

Following these new rules will result in greater environmental performance!

#### STAY AWAY FROM THE FLU: GET VACCINATED!

Annual vaccinations are the best way to prevent the flu. Combined with basic prevention measures like washing your hands, coughing into your elbow rather than into your hand and staying home when ill, reduces the transmission of the virus.

The vaccine is free for the following people:

- Children 6 to 23 months:
- People with certain chronic diseases;
- Pregnant women with certain chronic diseases, throughout pregnancy;
- Healthy pregnant women during the second and third trimesters;
- People aged 60 and over.
- Relatives of those mentioned above, including people who take care of them;
- Relatives of children under 6 months;
- Health workers.



For all others, the vaccine is available at a resonable cost in medical clinics and pharmacies in your area, contact them directly to know the dates and cost.

The vaccine against influenza is effective and safe. It cannot cause the flu or any other disease because the virus it contains is not alive. Sometimes light pain can be felt on the area where you received the vaccine and rarely, a slight fever and aches the day after vaccination. Much less important drawbacks compared to those of the flu that can affect us severely for several days.

#### SCHOOL BUS AND SECURITY

A new school year has started and we want to take a moment to remind our citizens of some important rules that will ensure the safety of our children.

# SO SCHOOL BUS, CO.

#### **Tips for drivers:**

- Reduce your speed: Obey speed limits in school zones and near playgrounds.
- **Mind the blind spots**: Be very careful in Mille-Isles's hilly streets where blind spots are numerous. You might not see the children waiting for the bus on top of the hill or on the curb.
- Stop when a school bus flashes its red lights and displays its stop signal. Vehicles travelling in both directions most stop in the presence of a school bus. Do not move until the lights stop flashing.
- Never pass another vehicle in a prohibited or unsafe area, be patient and proactive by leaving earlier.

#### **Tips for children:**

- **Keep your distances**: stay on the sidewalk or on the shoulder of the road, as far as possible from cars.
- **Be visible**: Wait for the bus standing up. Do not sit or lie down on the side of the road or in a snowbank. When it's dark in winter, wear a small flashing light or a reflective band or clothes.
- **Mind the blind spots**: If your house entrance is in a blind spot for drivers, like on top of a hill or in a curve, go wait for the bus a little further where it's safer.
- Never run to catch the bus. Arrive at least 5 minutes in advance.
- Wait for the bus driver's sign that lets you know it's safe to cross the street.

#### **CHRIST CHURCH MILLE ISLES, QUEBEC**

During the late 1840, Irish immigrants with strong Christian beliefs, a sense of humour and a love of music, helped to settle this land of tall spruce and sparking lakes. Missionaries, **Reverend Joseph Griffin** and **Mr. H.T. Goslin**, catechist, confronted the perils of the wilderness for the salvation of souls. With grim determination and apostolic zeal, they built a humble, square hewn log church with a commanding view on the land purchased from **Mr. John Pollock**, yeoman, whose descendants' still dwell here today. **The church was established in 1861.** 

The opening service was held on October 13, 1861, by the **Reverend H.B. Wray**. The theme for the service was Lilacs which mean 'HAPPINESS' (based on lilac roots that had been brought over from Ireland) the altar was adorned with lilacs.

In 1862 the **Rev. H.B. Wray** reports: "The congregation have so far shown themselves worthy of a resident minister. Two substantial wooden churches (one in Morin) have been put up, roofed in and floored, doors and windows made. The work is a result of self-sacrifice and much physical labour by the congregation."

In 1864 **The Rev. Joseph Merrick** reported: "The new church at Mille Isles is now insufficient to accommodate the congregation, so that it is in contemplation to build a larger one and convert the present building in to a school room. At first it was intended that the parsonage should be erected at Morin but as the congregation at **Mille Isles** is much the larger, and the people have expressed such a willingness to do their part, it seems only right they be permitted to carry out their intentions."

Christ Church was rebuilt in 1956, with knotty pine panelling on the interior. **Mr. John Ward**, was the General Contractor. The opening service was held in June 1957. The new pews, cut at a saw mill in Maniwake and assembled here were filled to capacity. The huge stained glass East Window, font and sanctuary chairs are gifts from St. Lawrence Church, Coteau Landing. Many memorials, including the handsome oak altar, show the love and respect of the parishioners. Sanctuary windows are in memory of **Canon** and **Mrs. E.W.P. Baugh**; the huge West Window in memory of **Colonel Garnet Strong** and **Mr. Gilbert Ryan**. The 24 modern stained glass windows, illustrating the first six verses of Psalm 97 in memory of many loved ones, were dedicated by Rt. **Rev. Russel Brown**, Bishop Suffragan of Montreal on September 27, 1981 – Canon Horace G. Baugh was Incumbent.

With grateful hearts we thank our past Incumbents, wardens, organists, women's committees, Lay delegates, officers and generous donors for their loyal support. Christ Church is a place where God's presence is felt, where worship inspires and uplifts all who come and where fellowship is vital. The seeds of our ancestors still grow and flourish with reverence and praise. May they continue to be nurtured with love and honour to the Glory of God.
