**The community garden is back at the town hall!** The vegetables, herbs and berries grown over the season are for everyone who wishes to collect them and will also be used for community cooking activities.



### A SUCCESSFUL INAUGURATION FOR THE TOWN AND COMMUNITY HALL

The interior renovations and upgrades to the town and community hall have been completed. The exterior work are now being finalized. Two separate events were held to celebrate the inauguration of the renovated building: a press conference and a meet and greet with the citizens. The press conference, attended by the deputy of Argenteuil and the warden of the RCM of Argenteuil, took place on April 4<sup>th</sup>. This event highlighted the support offered by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy for the renovation work and the financial aid of \$582 000. The residents of Mille-Isles had the chance to rediscover the building on April 13<sup>th</sup> during a meet and greet. More than 300 people came to visit the renovated building.

### REGULATIONS CONCERNING DOGS

Here are some reminders concerning our animal control By-law. The respect of these rules allows everyone to cohabitate and enjoy a safe, stress free environment. We thank you for respecting the by-law and its rules as well as applying them in a respectful and courteous way.

Any animal kept outside the unit of occupation of its owner or its guardians must be held or restrained by means of a device (tie, leash, fence, etc.) preventing it from leaving this land.

It is forbidden to leave an animal, at any time, wander in or on a public square, park, playground or private property other than the unit of occupation of the animals' owner or guardian.

No-one may keep a dog generally living within the limits of the municipality unless he has previously obtained a license in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.

You will find the complete By-law 2014-04 regarding animal control on the municipal website.

You can pick up a medal (license) for your dog at the town hall. **The medal is free.** The replacement cost for a lost medal is \$5.

### **MUNICIPAL MONARCH PLEDGE**

It is with a great pleasure that we announce that the municipality is now participating at the program "Municipal Monarch Pledge". It is by taking certain commitments and different actions that the municipality intends to contribute to the preservation of the monarch butterfly and encourage the creation of living spaces for this species. Individually, we can all help support monarchs by planting milkweed and native honey plants. A garden will be installed on municipal property along chemin de Mille-Isles to promote a favorable space for this species.





The municipality also registered on the <u>mission-monarch.org</u> site to assist in the survey of milkweed. By doing so, it wishes to contribute to the observation of caterpillars, eggs, chrysalis and adult monarchs. ### PLEASE DO NOT FEED THE DUCKS

Few people are aware that feeding ducks can have consequences not only for them, but also for the environment and for human health.



Bread is not suitable for birds since it is not part of their natural diet. For wild aquatic birds, aquatic plants and protein-rich microorganisms are required for breeding and growth of ducklings. Excess consumption of bread can even be harmful to their health. Indeed, a bread diet does not provide the energy necessary for their survival and makes them more vulnerable to cold weather. A British awareness campaign mentions that over-consumption of bread by birds can cause "angel wings" disease in farmed birds due to lack of wing development that prevents them from flying. Also, bread that is not eaten and molds in water causes the development of bacteria that can cause deadly diseases in ducks. Dependency on humans also disrupts their foraging behavior, their migratory cycle and makes them more vulnerable to predators.

In addition, an abnormal concentration of ducks on a small area increases the risk of epidemics among them. It also affects the environment and the health of the lake, including through fecal coliforms in their excrement. Fecal coliforms have an impact on the quality of bathing water and can cause diseases, the most common of which is gastroenteritis. Other parasites from duck feces may cause bather's dermatitis, a skin disease that does not pose a significant health hazard but causes rashes and itching that can last up to 10 days.

By avoiding feeding ducks, you help keep healthy populations and ensure that ducks maintain their natural behavior. For their safety, their health and ours, it is better to refrain from feeding them.

### **POISON IVY AND RAGWEED**

Poison ivy in itself can ruin your summer! How can we clearly identify poison ivy in order to protect ourselves and avoid this malicious plant?

**Poison ivy** grows in three forms: bushy, creeping or climbing. Its leaves are glossy and each has three leaflets. The edges of the leaves can be uneven, jagged or smooth and ribs are very present. During the months of June and July, this plant produces small white flowers.

The oily sap from poison ivy is called urushiol. It is **toxic** and can **cause painful skin inflammation 24 to 48 hours after contact**. If you touch this plant, wash quickly with water and wash your clothes in hot water. Dermatitis will disappear by itself 7 to 10 days later.

How can we eradicate it? You need to be as stubborn as it is! You must tear it out and make sure to remove all the roots beneath the ground and plow the ground often to ensure that there is no new roots. Another option is to smother the plant by installing a thick plastic over it for about one month. If you choose this option, make sure to cover a radius of at least 2 meters around the plant. It is important to place the plant in a clearly identified waste bag. **Never put it in the compost or burn it because inhaling the smoke could cause a severe pulmonary reaction.** 

Meanwhile, **ragweed** is in bloom from May to September and dies (thankfully!) during the first autumn frosts. It can grow up to one meter in height and its leaves are serrated, similar to carrot leaves. To get rid of it, simply pull it out of the soil or mow it.

**Quick tip:** Ragweed has trouble growing in luxurious and fertile lawns. So don't hesitate to improve the quality of your soil so that it does not grow again!

### **TEMPORARY CAR SHELTER REMOVAL**

It is time to remove your temporary carports. The deadline to remove the carports was May 1st to disassemble them (canvas and structure) and to store them until the fall.

### **OBTAINING A PERMIT**

**Spring and its warmer weather usually motivates residents to begin their renovation and maintenance projects.** Remember to visit the "Urban Planning" section of the municipal website to check for by-law regulations regarding your projects. Residents are also encouraged to contact **Mr. David Roy, Building Inspector**, by email or phone at <u>droy@mille-isles.ca</u> or 450 438-2958 ext. 2607 for guidance with renovation or construction projects.

At all times, it is essential that you dispose of you project's waste properly. To help, consult the list of materials accepted or refused at our **Ecocentre** "Les Bons Voisins". For example, wood, gypsum and asphalt shingles are accepted materials at the Ecocentre in small quantities. If materials are not accepted, or the quantities are too large, a container will be required during the renovation or construction period.

Also, remember that many of these materials can be recycled which is a great help to the environment.

### PRIVATE ROAD CULVERTS

This is a reminder for owners of private roads, whose road crosses a waterway.

Know that standards are in place to calibrate the culverts and avoid narrowing the stream. Communicate with **Mrs. Nathalie Bouchard, Environment Inspector**, by email or by phone at <u>nbouchard@mille-isles.ca</u> or 450 438-2958 ext. 2608 to find out what obligations apply to your situation.

### **NEW MUNICIPAL REGULATION IN EFFECT SINCE MAY 2018**

The Regulation respecting the evacuation and treatment of wastewater from isolated dwellings (RRQ, c, Q-2, r.22) states that a septic system must be emptied every two (2) years if the building is used as a primary residence (yearly) and every four (4) years if it is used seasonally (regardless of whether the septic tank has a capacity greater than the number of bedrooms in the building).

It is now required for owners to send the municipality proof that the septic tank has been emptied according to the category of the building (primary residence or seasonal) before **OCTOBER 1**st of each year when the emptying takes place. Failure to submit proof that the system bas been emptied and following a notice sent to the owners, the municipality will be obliged to proceed with the emptying of the septic tank. Fees will be added to the municipal tax bill belonging to the residence in default.

In the meantime, you must complete the declaration found within this Info Mille-Isles (also available on the municipal website) and send it to <u>alarocque@mille-isles.ca</u> as soon as possible to ensure that the municipality knows the nature of the use of your property. If you do not send the completed declaration, your property will be considered as a permanent residence and therefore the septic tank will need to be emptied every two (2) years.
