#### FIREFIGHTERS' FOOD DRIVE

This year, the firefighter's food drive will take place on **Saturday, November 21, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.** However, the door-to-door collection procedure has been reviewed and adapted to the current context of COVID-19. In order to ensure the health and safety of all, citizens of Mille-Isles are invited to come and carry non-perishable food items or to make a cash donation through a drive-thru service. Teams of volunteers will collect food and donations directly at the cars, without direct contact with the donors.

### Here are the four (4) locations that will be available to you:

- 1. At the intersection of Hector Road and Scraire Road;
- 2. At the intersection of Côte Saint-Gabriel and Tamaracouta Road;
- 3. At the intersection of Black Road and Mille-Isles Road;
- 4. At the intersection of Riddell Road and Mille-Isles Road.

On the same day, a home collection service will be offered to citizens with special circumstances (reduced mobility or no means of transport). These persons are invited to call 450 431-2012 to inform the volunteer firefighters and benefit from this assistance.

To assist the firefighters on this day, please contact Mr. Alain Charbonneau at acharbonneau@mille-isles.ca. You can also bring your non-perishable food items and donations directly to Town Hall during business hours until November 20 inclusively.

This annual collection consists of supporting the Centre d'entraide d'Argenteuil in its mission to help people in a situation of food insecurity. Last year, Mille-Isles firefighters' food drive collected more than 25 food baskets and close to \$1,353.00, which helped soften the holidays for several dozen families.

#### **CHRISTMAS BASKET**

Requests for a Christmas basket from the Centre d'entraide d'Argenteuil are made directly to the Municipality of Mille-Isles until November 30, 2020.

You must call 450 438-2958 ext. 2610 to make an appointment. Upon registration, proof of residence, proof of income and a \$5 payment will be required.

Christmas baskets will be handed out on Tuesday, December 15, 2020, between 3:30 p.m. and 4:00 p.m., at Town Hall located at 1262 Mille-Isles Road.

# **MAYOR'S ADDRESS**

Hello everyone,

Congratulations to us on the good work we are doing as a community to combat COVID-19. For now, we remain in the orange zone (under surveillance), so we still have the privileges that those in the red zones do not. It is important to continue maintaining our efforts to keep them! Also, I ask you to remain respectful to the people you meet, whether it is at Town Hall or with your neighbors. Even though you may be frustrated, understand that these conditions are not the fault of the person you are communicating with.

Many of you may have noticed that the paving of Tamaracouta Road started and stopped in the same week. The weather being unfavorable, the paving had to be suspended. It looks as though we will have a window of 7 to 10 days of good weather to allow paving to resume; fingers crossed! Also, we are still waiting for confirmation on our request for an extension of the deadlines from the ministère des Transports, since it was they that caused the delays. We are told that analyses are numerous and complex. It is unfortunate that common sense seems to have lost its place in the administrative machinery in Quebec City. I invite you to follow the Infoworks in the Newsletter and on the Municipality's website for further developments in this matter.

Council passed a notice of motion to designate part of the Tamaracouta Scout Reserve as a heritage site. The process is now underway following the tabling of the Heritage Committee's recommendations and the detailed report on the heritage value of the camp. There will be a public information session on the subject held by the Local Heritage Council where you will be able to express yourself your questions answered. The session will be held on November at 6:30 p.m. Strong Community Please note that current health measures require room space to 10 people. However, the session will be available in webcast on November 18. Please visit the Municipality's website in the Municipal Council menu under the Heritage tab to set the link to the meeting.

There is also the high-speed Internet project which is still a hot topic and you should know that citizens of our MRC who pre-register for the upcoming service will be entitled to a priority connection when it is officially available. I invite you to visit the Fibre Argenteuil website (NPO formed by our MRC) for more information.

In closing, I would like to thank the municipal team, including employees, service directors and administrators, who form a tight-knit team. They succeed in serving the population in a professional and respectful manner by working together to help the citizens of our Municipality, despite the constraints that COVID-19 and sanitary measures bring to the table.

#### Payment of municipal taxes in 2021

As a result, most citizens will be able to pay their taxes in six (6) installments next year, compared to three (3) installments this year, to allow you a better budget planning by reducing the amount of your payments.

However, the single or first payment must be made no later than February 26, 2021.

### **ROADS, HERITAGE AND HISTORY!**

Maps are one of the oldest human inventions that have survived the passage of time. For my part, I have always found them interesting to read, because often we can see the historical evolution of a territory.

Based on Internet data from "Map of the counties of Terrebonne, Two Mountains and Argenteuil 1861", I discovered that Mille-Isles was formerly called Sainte-Angélique. This name bears witness to the seigniorial past of Louise-Angélique, daughter of Eustache-Louis Lambert Dumont and wife of Antoine Lefebyre Bellefeuille.

According to the June 2004 edition 6 of the Porcupine magazine of the Association Historique de Morin-Heights, Mille-Isles road was originally named de la Côte Sainte-Angélique Road. Although it is on the official plan dated 1881, this road became des Mille-Isles Road to finally be named today de Mille-Isles Road.

Our Municipality has been geographically divided into several sectors and the use of the word côte was part of the toponymy of our roads, with good reason. In fact, we can see it with the Côte Saint-Joseph and the Côte Saint-Eustache. In addition, from Cambria Road to the Township of Morin (Morin-Heights) was Côte Sainte-Marguerite, renamed Tamaracouta Road (see the September edition) as well as Côte Sainte-Angélique which is now de Mille-Isles Road.

One era followed another and other changes appeared around 1920 with the use of the word montée, notably Route 329, which was formerly Montée Sainte-Agathe and Route 30.
