



NEW BY-LAW ON THE DISPLAY OF CIVIC NUMBERS

In order for emergency services to respond quickly and effectively, it is extremely important that your civic number is visible at all times. In the interest and safety of all citizens of Mille-Isles, by-law 2021-01 concerning the display of civic numbers has just been adopted. Here are some of the criterias to respect:

- ✓ The civic number must be assigned by a municipal officer;
- ✓ The height of numbers or letters must not be less than 13 cm (5.1 in.) and the width must not be less than 8 cm (3.1 in.);
- ✓ When the main facade of the building is located more than ten (10) meters from a public road, the civic number shall be installed at the edge of this road;
- ✓ The civic number must be easily identifiable day and night and must be visible at all times from both vehicular directions of the road.

TAMARACOUTA ROAD

Beginning this spring, excavation and reloading work will resume between Tamaracouta Scout camp and the Tamaracouta lake outlet. In addition, the gravel section between Black Road and Mille-Isles Road will be paved. Note that the culvert at the Tamaracouta lake outlet, along with three (3) other sections of the road, will not be part of the 2020 - 2021 reconstruction project. According to the ministère des Transports du Québec, the current state of the road does not justify an immediate intervention.

The rehabilitation of Black Road, between Mille-Isles and Cascades Roads, will also begin this spring and will run until the end of July 2021.

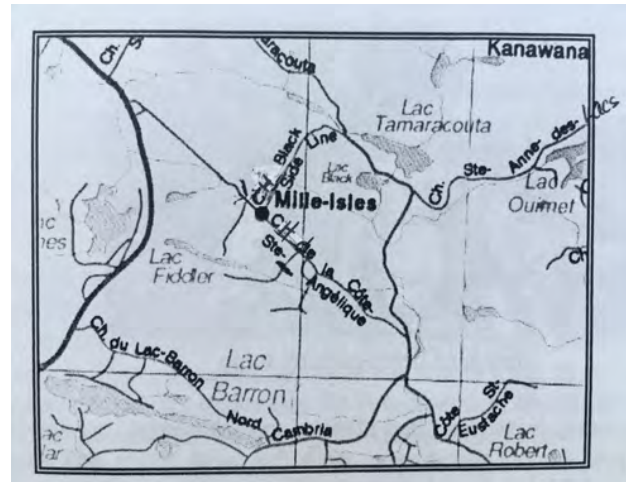
THESE ROADS REFORESTED

Unknown to most but still present, Morrow Road and Shrewsbury Road are part of our history.

Looking at old maps and consulting the "Mille-Isles Pioneer" and the "Porcupine" edition, I realized that Morrow Road in Mille-Isles was previously known as Sainte-Anne-des-Lacs Road. This road used to lead to Lake Ouimet and Lake Marois, but today it is private and a dead end. However, I can imagine that at one time, this road must have been as beautiful in the mountains as it is now overgrown.

According to the 1994 and 1996 publication of the Commission de toponymie du Quebec, Shrewsbury was one of the oldest names of the English nobility dating back to the time of William the Conqueror (1071). The name given to Shrewsbury Road, comes from two elements borrowed from the toponymy of England; that is, SHRUB which means bush and BURB-BOURG which means village. It was in 1830 that the first settlers took possession of the plots of land along this road, formerly linking the village of Shrewsbury to Mille-Isles. Unfortunately, the Great Depression of the 1880s gradually led to the abandonment of the area. Only the Barnes Beardmore residence and a small farm house were able to withstand this sad fate. Today, a small part of Shrewsbury Road, from Mille-Isles to Gore, has reforested naturally.

MUNICIPAL GENERAL ELECTIONS ON NOVEMBER 7, 2021

Is your domicile located outside of the Municipality of Mille-Isles?

You may have the right to vote if you are the owner of an immovable or if you have been the occupant of a business establishment in the Municipality since September 1, 2021.

You may be entitled to this right if, for instance, you are:

- ✓ owner or co-owner of an immovable;
- ✓ owner or co-owner of a cottage or secondary residence;
- ✓ occupant or co-occupant of a business establishment.

To have this right, you must be 18 years of age or older on election day and be a Canadian citizen on September 1, 2021. You must not be under curatorship or deprived of your electoral rights on that date.

To exercise your right to vote, you must send an application for registration to the electoral officer.

How to apply?

The form to complete varies according to the applicant:

- ✓ The sole owner of an immovable or the sole occupant of a business establishment must fill the SMR-9.2 form;
- ✓ The co-owners of an immovable or the co-occupants of a business establishment must designate one person among them to be registered on the list. To do so, they must fill the SMR-9.1 form.

The forms are available on the Municipality's website at www.mille-isles.ca, under the "Municipal Council" tab in the "Municipal Election 2021" section and click on the subject button "Your home is not located in Mille-Isles?". The chosen form must be completed and sent to the address indicated below.

The application for entry on the list of electors or power of attorney remains valid until it is replaced or withdrawn. If you want to replace or withdraw an existing application or power of attorney, please contact the electoral officer at 450 438-2958 ext. 2620.

For the application to be valid for the 2021 election, the Municipality must receive it by the set deadline for making an application to amend with the Board of revisors. The electoral officer will specify this date in a public notice in the coming months.
