MAYOR'S ADDRESS

March 2022 Edition

Hello everyone,

As you all know, sanitary measures are beginning to disappear, despite the continued presence of the Corona virus. Nevertheless, we continue to follow these measures, and look forward, like you, to return to normalcy.

On another side, High-speed Internet service from Fibre Argenteuil is starting to be available to all those who have pre-subscribed. For those who have not yet made their request, time is running out because the connection teams are currently in Mille-Isles and are proceeding with installations in the houses for approximately the next six (6) weeks.

On February 15, the City Council of Saint-Jérôme adopted a resolution regarding Bell's request for the installation of a tower near Lac Paul. The resolution that was adopted, is unfavorable for the establishment of the tower in the requested area, which is an agro-forestry area. We must remember however, that it is up to Industry Canada to decide and we are awaiting this decision. It is not over, but it's not a done deal for Bell with this important support from Saint-Jérôme. We are very grateful to Mayor Bourcier and his team for having made this informed and fair decision. They too are limited in the application of municipal regulations, since this tower project is under federal jurisdiction.

Before the regular meeting of March 2, 2022, we held a public information session to explain the proposed changes to the usage grids for the two zones that include the Tamaracouta Scout Reserve. The reasoning of the previous council was to protect the site by formally acknowledging it via a heritage citation. However, this only covered the camp with existing structures on the south side of the lake. Council also expressed its desire to protect the area north of the lake as an important ecological area to be protect through its urban plan. We are now putting our words into action with the adoption of the regulations.

What to say about the Mille-Isles Road: have you noticed that the municipal roads are very well maintained, especially if we look at what is happening on Mille-Isles Road? Our contractor is doing a fantastic job, as always, and we thank them. It's easy to observe that as you go up from Bellefeuille to Mille-Isles, the Bellefeuille section is on asphalt or almost, and the second you cross the line into Mille-Isles, you find yourself navigating on a glacier along its length. This is ridiculous and potentially very dangerous. We will advise the MTQ again. On the other hand, this winter their contractor in snow removal seems to have decided that layers of ice were normal on a road of the Ministère du Transport du Québec, but only on the territory of our municipality. Moreover, we can notice that it has little or no abrasive with or without salt which seems to be used with result that there are deep grooves in the two (2) ways of traffic. We were told that the only way to get the MTQ to move is to call 511 and make a complaint. Just mention that there is a lack of abrasives on the road and it has become very dangerous. So please do something about it and ask your neighbors to do the same. Do it several times and don't be embarrassed to report their shortcomings to the MTQ.

Finally, I ask you to stay on the lookout for changes related to health instructions. We all know that since March 12, the Quebec government has lifted most of the health measures related to the COVID-19 pandemic. It may be a return to normal for us, hope the same for the citizens of Ukraine.
