# HERITAGE

### THE DEMOGRAPHIC GROWTH OF 170 YEARS OF MILLE-ISLES HISTORY

Although the region was settled in the 1830s, nearly 200 years ago, the establishment and construction of the first log or hewn wooden houses, chopped with an axe, took place gradually. On May 29, 1844, 42 landowners reached an agreement while awaiting the construction of an official road. The municipality, which included the sectors of Côtes Sainte-Angélique (Chemin de Mille-Isles), Saint-Joseph, Saint-Eustache, and Sainte-Marguerite (Chemin Tamaracouta), detached from the parish of Saint-Jérôme, was officially created on July 1, 1855, with Andrew Elliott elected as the first mayor.

During the 1861 census, the population stood at 561 residents. Twenty years later, in 1881, the population remained nearly stable at 567 residents (287 men and 280 women) and 89 houses, five of which were unoccupied. However, starting in 1891, a demographic decline was observed, with 519 residents. The population continued to drop, reaching its lowest point in 1931, with only 231 residents, less than half of the number recorded in 1891.

It wasn't until 1971 that a steady population growth began, reaching 370 residents. Over the years, the population continued to rise, increasing by nearly 300 people every ten years. In 2001, the total population was 1,210. According to the latest data (MAMH, 2025), Mille-Isles now has 1,838 citizens.

The legacy of our pioneers is still very much present, embodied by the built heritage and landscapes that bear witness to our rich and vibrant history. This story has kept being woven, day by day, and that for almost 2 centuries.
